

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The practice of Christian meditation

- Consideration
- Soliloquy (self talk)
- Prayer



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First meditation John 11:1-17-32

Meditate on the experience of Mary and Martha; their sense of bewilderment and loss; their confusion in the face of Jesus not appearing.

Connect that with your own experience or the experience of those you love

Speak to God about this sense of confusion and struggle



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Second meditation John 11:28-37

Meditate on the emotions of Christ; his indignation in the face of death; his tears and sorrow;

Consider how Christ has drawn near; that he, in all his glory, has come close to us; that he does so at great personal cost by entering into our own emotional struggle – even, finally, at the cross.



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Third meditation John 11:38-44

Meditate on the majesty and glory of Christ; his power and might; his incomparably great power and his final victory over death and sin and evil.

Meditate on the freedom we find as we see his glory; what he has done sets us free because when we are consumed with his glory, we are no longer bound by the grave clothes of self interest.
