Unity matters

How good and pleasant it is
when God's people live together in unity!

Reputation matters

He must not be a recent convert, or he may become conceited and fall under the same judgment as the devil. **He must also have a good reputation with outsiders**

1 Timothy 3:6-7

Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, **they may see your good deeds** and glorify God on the day he visits us.

1 Peter 2:12

In the same way, let your light shine before others, that **they may see your good deeds** and glorify your Father in heaven.

Conversation killers:

- What is important enough to disrupt unity for?
- What reputation should we want?

Conversation killers:

Very troubling, and often hidden

Five warning signs

- Invoking divine authority
- Undermining dissenting voices
- Threatening exclusion
- Accountability captured
- Binary thinking



Conversation killers:

- How accountable are our leaders?
- How shared is our decision making?

Revelation 7:9-10

After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice:

“Salvation belongs to our God,
who sits on the throne,
and to the Lamb.”



Revelation 7:17-8:1

‘Never again will they hunger;
never again will they thirst.
The sun will not beat down on them,
nor any scorching heat.
For the Lamb at the centre of the throne
will be their shepherd;
‘he will lead them to springs of living water.’
‘And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.’”

When he opened the seventh seal, there was silence in heaven
