# Seminars

By providing opportunities to interact with others, the fortnightly seminars help students to deepen their personal grasp of course material. In-person seminars typically run on a weekday evening and are offered in a number of centres around the UK. Online seminars are available both in the evening and daytime.

# FOUNDATIONS IN BIBLICAL COUNSELLING



Underlying the course is a conviction that the gospel connects with every human experience and struggle, and a desire to help church communities connect the riches of Scripture to the realities of life.

Starting with an emphasis on our own need for biblical change and personal growth in wisdom, the course then seeks to build students' confidence in conversational ministry with a goal of developing the deep, relational one-anothering that the New Testament describes.

The course provides a model for ministry that is applicable to formal and informal ministry contexts – from opening Scripture with a friend in the hard moments of life, to shaping preaching that engages the heart.

Youth workers, small group leaders, pastors, secular counsellors and ordinary church members eager to be better equipped to help friends, will all benefit.

## Course content

- Combines material from CCEF's School of Biblical Counselling with new content developed by BCUK for the UK context.
- Lectures, reading and assignments are delivered via an online learning platform which students access at a time that suits them.
- Fortnightly seminars with an experienced tutor encourage the development of practical skills in personal ministry and provide interaction with other students.
- An optional week-long Summer Intensive develops a student's personal attributes and skills in conversational ministry.
- The Certificate is completed in one academic year.
- The first module, *Dynamics of Biblical Change*, provides a foundation for all the others but can be taken for stand-alone study, either in the first term of the Foundations Certificate, or in the slower-paced 6-month option. It can also be taken as part of a ministry sabbatical with flexible start times during the year. (see biblicalcounselling.org.uk/dynamics-6-months)

# Programme

#### **AUTUMN TERM - DYNAMICS OF BIBLICAL CHANGE**

The way that you counsel other people is determined by how you understand God, yourself, other people, life's pressures, and change. This module addresses the depth, breadth, and balance of your understanding. How does Christ's past grace, present grace, and future grace speak to our hearts and change how we live our daily lives? Through case studies, lectures, assigned readings, and Scripture, you'll explore these practical questions. Self-counselling projects will help you to make first-hand, practical application of the concepts presented.

#### **SPRING TERM - HELPING RELATIONSHIPS**

This module takes what you learned in *Dynamics of Biblical Change* and helps you to apply it in interpersonal ministry. Case studies, lectures, and group discussions will help you grow in your ability to listen well, know people, interpret another person's story from a biblical perspective, and offer biblically-based truth that will motivate others in their growth in Christ.

#### **SUMMER TERM - COUNSELLING IN THE LOCAL CHURCH**

Topics covered include: church as community; pastoral care and evangelism; praying for your church; a brief history of pastoral care and the modern biblical counselling movement; every member ministry in the local congregation; the role of pastors and elders; pastoral care structure; creating cultures of care; confidentiality; supervision; boundaries; church discipline and the role of parachurch organisations.

## Assessment

All the modules have required assignments and a final exam or project. The time commitment varies according to the module but a rough guide is 8–10 hours per week in addition to the time required to attend the fortnightly seminars.

There are no minimum academic requirements, but students should be aware that there is a significant amount of reading which includes both book extracts and journal articles.
