

Dynamics of Biblical Change over 6 Months

JANUARY - JULY 2024

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Course description

The way you counsel others is determined by how you understand God, yourself, other people, life's pressures, and, of course, the process of change. *Dynamics of Biblical Change* addresses these things and more. It describes how Christ's past grace, present grace, and future grace speak to our hearts and change the way we live our daily lives.

This course is about people and the way they (and we) face the troubles of life. It is about dealing with our inner struggles and changing into the likeness of Christ. Through Scripture, online lectures, assigned readings and case studies, you'll explore these practical ministry questions. Two self-counselling projects are key to applying the principles of the course personally.

Each "week" of the course includes two- to three-hours of videoed lectures, assigned reading and interaction with the other students through an online discussion board. Progress is assessed by written assignments (see the course schedule for due dates) and a final exam.

Course Background

The *Dynamics of Biblical Change* course is the first and key module of our Foundations in Biblical Counselling Certificate. It has been developed over many years by CCEF's <u>School of Biblical Counselling</u>, and Biblical Counselling UK is delighted to be able to offer their material in the UK and shape it for the UK context.

Dynamics over 6 months is a stand-alone, slower-paced version of the standard 12-week course, designed to make it easier for those whose ministry, work and/or home commitments would make it difficult for them to take the regular course.

Transfer to Biblical Counselling UK's or CCEF's programmes

Dynamics over 6 months is directly transferable to Biblical Counselling UK's Certificate Course programme. Students who have taken *Dynamics over 6 months* are also eligible to register for CCEF's online courses, but will be unable to transfer credit towards CCEF's Formation Certificate. Lecturer

David Powlison (1949–2019) served as CCEF's executive director, as a faculty member and as a senior editor of the *Journal of Biblical Counseling*. He held a PhD from the University of Pennsylvania and an MDiv from Westminster Theological Seminary.

David wrote extensively on biblical counselling and on the relationship between faith and psychology. His books, *Seeing with New Eyes*, and *Speaking the Truth in Love*, probe the implications of Scripture for how to understand people and how to counsel. *The Biblical Counseling Movement: History and Context* explores the background and development of CCEF's mission. David's later books include *God's Grace in Your Suffering, How Does Sanctification Work?*, *Good and Angry*, and his final work, *Safe and Sound*, which was published posthumously.

Optional Seminars

The course includes two optional evening seminars with a Biblical Counselling UK tutor. They will be delivered via Zoom and will provide teaching and online discussion with other students. The seminars are optional, but we do hope that you will be able to join one or both of them.

Canvas

You will receive access to Canvas, our online learning platform, about 3 weeks before the start of the course. When you log in you will find videos showing you how to use the platform, access the course lectures, documents and readings and how to upload assignments. The lectures are available both in a video format that you can stream online as well as in a downloadable MP3 (audio only) file.

^{*} This is a timed exam consisting of multiple-choice questions and two short essay questions. It will be available on Canvas from 2 July, and you have a two-week "window" within which to take it. You can arrange to take the exam early (eg because of summer holiday arrangements). Your revised due date will be two weeks after the date you have access to the exam.

Required reading

You will need access to a copy of ONE of the following books:

- *God's Grace in Your Suffering by David Powlison (Crossway)
 When God Weeps by Joni Eareckson Tada (Zondervan)

All other required reading is provided via Canvas.

- 2) Apply for an account upgrade:

 - Enter your name and email address
 - Enter "BCUK" for the institution
 - For "Study End Date" enter the date you expect to finish studying with BCUK (eg 1, 2 or 3 years hence)

Once you have completed and submitted the form, 10ofthose will email you to confirm the upgrade request.

Technical requirements

We strongly recommend that students have access to and experience with a desktop or laptop (not just an iPad or mobile device) with internet access, as well as Microsoft Word or a word processor that can export files in a .doc or .docx format. Canvas recommends using Google Chrome for your browser when accessing the classroom.

There is a Canvas Mobile App available, although the Canvas app does not have the same functionality as using Canvas on your computer. We therefore **strongly recommend** that you use your computer as your main access to modules and use the app to supplement this access. Please also note that we cannot offer technical support if you have issues with the app.
